I had thought that these were an apricot colored variety of Amanita Muscaria but apparently they are more closely related to Amanita Gemmata. Personally I believe that it would be very unwise to ingest this. The classic red Amanita Muscaria is much easier to positively identify and use safely. They are very beautiful though.
